

Primary Talk

Primary Talk is a whole school programme for staff working with children aged 5-11.

It improves staff knowledge and understanding of speech, language and communication and embeds learning by supporting participants to create personal action plans, providing resources to support the identification of speech language and communication needs (SLCN) and auditing whole school practice.

Three levels of *Primary Talk*

Supportive:

Communication supportive environment for all children

Enhanced:

Targeted support for children with SLCN

Specialist:

Specialist support for children with complex SLCN



Primary Talk training

Improves the skills and confidence of staff to support all pupils' communication skills by giving them the knowledge to establish practical strategies and approaches.

Primary Talk training supports schools to:

- Develop understanding of typical speech, language and communication development.
- Identify children with speech, language and communication needs.
- Use strategies and approaches that will contribute to high quality teaching, helping schools to raise pupil attainment.
- Develop the foundation skills for literacy.
- Contribute to improving behaviour.
- Develop communication skills across the curriculum.
- Develop the social aspects of learning making friends, working in groups, and building relationships.
- Work collaboratively with parents and other professionals.



Primary Talk accreditation

An award that recognises good practice in speech language and communication in primary years, demonstrating that a school is supporting the communication needs of children.

Primary Talk accreditation provides tools to audit current practice and a framework for building a communication supportive environment. Accreditation is an effective way to ensure that what is learnt in training is put into practice.

At I CAN we recognise the challenge to schools of moving from recording the input of what they provide for children to evaluating the impact (for children) of these activities. *Primary Talk* accreditation supports schools to reflect on the outcomes of their support for children – the 'so what difference does this make?' element.

The benefits:

- Provides a structure to focus on improved outcomes for children, especially in literacy.
- Can be used alongside other school initiatives to raise attainment and contribute to meeting Government floor standards.
- Provides schools with a clear structure to demonstrate the effectiveness and impact of their provision for the development of the communication aspects of the Ofsted framework.
- Involves all staff to improve children's communication across the school.

Ofsted now evaluates how well pupils develop their communication skills, how well they apply them across the curriculum and how well teachers teach communication.

For those children who have been identified as having language delay you may consider *Talk Boost*. A targeted and evidence-based intervention, which supports children in Key Stage 1. *Talk Boost* can boost a child's communication by an average of 9-18 months after 10 weeks of intervention.
